I hope that the initiative would add to the promotion of JAPS and reflect on the professional commitment of the publisher.

The JAPS is now reviewed and indexed in the Mathematical Reviews, MathSciNet, and Zentralblatt fur Mathematik databases. Our aim is to include JAPS in all relevant major citations within the shortest possible time.

I thank all the reviewers who have spent valuable time and efforts to help JAPS. We recognise their contributions and look forward to their on going support. The associate editors have done a fantastic job. I congratulate them all. Finally I thank all those who have directly or indirectly contributed to the growth and elevation of JAPS as a professional peer-reviewed international journal. I look forward to hearing comments and feedback from our readers and well-wishers. Specific suggestions to improve the quality and impact of JAPS are always welcome.
